Class XI

Course Of Study

Subjects –

1 and 2: Two Languages (Core/Elective) (Out of list given by CBSE in scheme of studies)

3,4 and 5: Three Elective (Out of list given by CBSE in scheme of studies)

Note –

- Out of the languages, one shall be English or Hindi, both English and Hindi can also be offered simultaneously.
- The language may be offered either at Core / Elective level. The same language however cannot be offered both at the Core and Elective Level.
- A candidate has the freedom to offer, in lieu of one of the two languages above, any other Elective subject mentioned in the list.
- General studies
- Work Experience
- Physical and Health Edu.

- **Rule 29** – In order to declare pass, a student must secure 33 % marks in each of the subject studied by him /her subject to the condition that:
 1. The student should secure 33 % in each of the following subjects
 1. Language (Core/Elective)
 - 2,3,4 and 5 any four Subjects under any stream which may include language as well
 2. He/She secures 33 % marks separately in theory and practical portion
 3. The promotion is also subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% marks should be secured in the comprehensive test i.e. annual

Note: While calculating 25 % or 33 % the benefit of fraction will go the credit of the student

• Result Module –

The checks in the result modules are as follows:

1. English/Hindi/Sanskrit/Urdu (Core/Elective)
 - a. 25 % of 75 i.e. 18
 - b. 33 % of 100 i.e. 33
2. Maths/Pol Sci/ Accountancy/History/Economics/Business Studies
 - a. 25 % of 75 i.e. 18
 - b. 33 % of 100 i.e. 33
3. Phy/Chem/Bio/Geog/Agriculture/Comp Sci/Informatics Practise/Pshycology
 - a. 25 % of 50(Comprehensive Th) i.e. 12
 - b. 33 % of 70(Total Th) i.e. 23
 - c. 33 % of 30(Total Pract) i.e. 10
 - d. 33 % of 100(Total) i.e. 33
4. Music/Fine Arts/ Dance
 - a. 25 % of 25 i.e. 6
 - b. 33 % of 30 i.e. 10
 - c. 33 % of 70 i.e. 23
 - d. 33 % of 100 i.e. 33

- **Rule 35** – Grace marks upto maximum of 10 in all shall be awarded to a student to enable him/her to reach the minimum required of 33% of marks in each of the subject provided:
 - A minimum of 25 % of marks is secured in each of the subject at the comprehensive test as per Rule 29
 - Maximum marks to be granted in one subject are 5
 - No grace marks are awarded to students taking compartmental examination

Note:- No grace marks are to be given in Comprehensive exams

- **Rule 32 – Compartmental Examination**

A student who has appeared in comprehensive exam but is not eligible for promotion to next class is eligible for appearing in the compartmental examination provided:

1. He/She has secured atleast 20 % marks in 1 failing subject i.e. (20 or more out of 100)

OR

Incase the Candidate gets atleast 15 % of marks in one failing subject (i.e. cases where marks are ≥ 15 but < 20) and 40 % marks in aggregate in the remaining subjects, he/she is also eligible for appearing in compartmental examination

2. For practical subjects, the rule is generally interpreted as follows (as per CBSE norms) –

a. If a student has failed in theory , compartment is given in theory only

b. If a student has failed in practical, he/she has to appear both in theory and practical

Additional Subjects

Candidates offering additional subjects norms mentioned under Clause 2.5(iv) of pass criteria of CBSE Sr. School curriculum 2009 are being followed.

a. A language offered as a additional subject may replace a language in the event of a candidate failing in the same provided after replacement the candidate has Eng/Hindi as one of the languages.

b. An elective subject offered as an additional subject may replace one of the elective subjects offered by the candidate it may also replace a language provided after replacement that candidate has Eng/Hindi as one of the languages.

c. Additional Language offered at Elective level may replace an elective subjects provided after replacement the no. of languages offered shall not exceed two

- **Rule 17 – Medical Cases**

Incase a student is unable to appear in one or more subject on medical grounds in

1. Comprehensive exam: Students are allowed to take the exam in those subjects along with the compartmental students. Rules of compartmental exams will be applicable i.e. student will have to obtain 33 % marks in the examination w/o any grace marks or addition of terminal examination marks.

2. 1st Terminal or 2nd Terminal exam: Test may be ignored for computation of the Result and marks may be calculated by considering (1st Terminal + Comprehensive exam or 2nd Terminal + Comprehensive exam)

3. 1st Terminal and 2nd Terminal both: One test is ignored and considered marks obtained as 0 in another terminal test and result is to be calculated as above
